## Living things

1	<b>Reproduction</b>	the production of offspring by a sexual or asexual process
2	<b>characteristics</b>	a feature or quality belonging to a person, place, or thing and serving to identify them
3	<b>classification</b>	the arrangement of animals and plants in groups according to their observed similarities
4	<b>features</b>	a distinctive attribute or aspect of something (that helps identify them)
5	<b>degeneration</b>	deterioration and loss of function in the cells of a tissue or organ
6	<b>Adolescence</b>	the period following the onset of puberty during which a young person develops from a child into an adult
7	<b>Mammals</b>	a warm-blooded vertebrate animal. Has hair or fur, females that secrete milk for the nourishment of the young, and (typically) the birth of live young.
8	<b>birds</b>	a warm-blooded egg-laying vertebrate animal. Has feathers, wings, a beak, and typically can fly.
9	<b>reptiles</b>	a vertebrate animal of a class that includes snakes, lizards, crocodiles, turtles, and tortoises. They have dry scaly skin and typically lay soft-shelled eggs on land.
10	<b>Amphibians</b>	a cold-blooded vertebrate animal of a class that comprises the frogs, toads, newts, salamanders, and caecilians. They have an aquatic gill-breathing larval stage followed (typically) by a terrestrial lung-breathing adult stage.
